#### THE TEXT

- 1. It was a promise made to her father that started Nancy down the path to a Bachelor of Applied Studies (BAS) degree. Nancy, who was 51 years old at the time she started her degree, had never attended college before pursuing her BAS. "My dad died suddenly in May 2011 and I'd always promised <u>him</u> that I'd get a bachelor's degree," says Nancy. "His death made me realize just how short life can be, so I set out to keep the promise I'd made to him so many years ago."
- "Taking online courses was a challenge at first, but I quickly grew accustomed to posting on discussion boards and interacting with my classmates online. It was also reassuring to discover just how many individuals were going back to finish degrees begun before life interceded."
- 3. Taking courses online allowed Nancy to carry anywhere from six to nine credits per semester, while working fulltime as a case manager at the Mason City Child Support Recovery Unit. It is a demanding position with a caseload that averages 1000 cases at a time. Having a bachelor's degree will now allow Nancy to apply for the many positions that require a bachelor's degree.
- 4. Perhaps the greatest joy comes from knowing it is never too late to keep a promise. "I have never been so proud of myself as when I walked across the stage to receive my diploma," says Nancy. "Knowing that my mom was in the audience along with my children made the moment special."
